- 2. All presented papers will be compiled and published in a book with an ISBN No.[Abstracts (1 page) and Articles (not more than 10 pages in Times New Roman)]
- 3. In-depth analysis of Jain Philosophy in the Modern Context
- 4. Spreading awareness of the core Jain Philosophy and Practices
- 5. Scholars will have the opportunity to share their latest research and insights.

Scholars, Research Scholars, Students, Experts working in the field of Jainism are expected to participate. Only New Findings in the field of Jain Philosophy need to be addressed. Abstracts and Papers will pass through an Editorial Scrutiny before being called up for presentation. Travel fare by 3rd AC shall be provided to outstation Presenters along with the basic Hospitality during the Seminar. Presenters will receive a Certificate of Presentation and a token Honorarium.

Presentation Guidelines:

Duration: Each presentation should be concise 10 min for students and not exceed

20 minutes for experts.

Content: The presentation must remain focused and strictly relevant to the assigned topic.

Number of Speakers: The conference will feature 40-60 speakers.

Session Structure:

Plenary and Parallel Sessions: Sessions will be conducted in parallel multiple halls, giving the audience the flexibility to choose which to attend.

Presided by Scholars: Each session will be chaired by a senior scholar with expertise in the respective subject matter.

Mandatory Submission: Scholars must submit a detailed article prior to the conference. Failure to do so will disqualify them from presenting.

Live Streaming:

The entire conference will be live-streamed on YouTube channel to ensure wider accessibility.

Hybrid – Online and Offline Sessions.
